The D-7Z was a short lived answer to the difficult problem of needing vast numbers of front-line vessels as conflict near the Klingon Empire increased in the 2360. The vessel would prove vital during the Dominion War in the 2370's, but would also see the final end to construction of the D-7 within the Klingon Empire. Only 27 new hulls were constructed between 2362 and 2371. It was soon discovered that the improvements over the older D-7Y were not as significant as originally anticipated, and only 92 were converted from that production run.

Following the war, which saw the loss of 17 of these ships, only 20 remain in active service. 8 have been sold to ranging families in the empire. 1 was scrapped and 73 are in reserve fleets, although some of these hulls are believed to be over 40 years old.
